Among the topics discussed were initiatives to serve disabled veterans and R2W's mission and objectives were extensively showcased during these meetings. This June R2W won the US. Department of Defense's Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve program (ESGR) [Seven Seals Award](#) for "their exceptional support of the Military and Veterans Employment Expo" held in May 2011.
